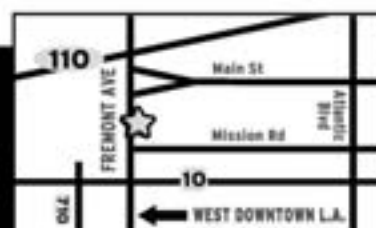

economic time.
"We must do everything we can to help protect our schools from the effects of our economy—that's why these Recovery Act dollars are so important," said Governor Schwarzenegger. "I have always said our kids should have the first run at our treasury, and that's true of the Recovery Act dollars too."

"I'm proud that through our swift action California is the first state to be awarded these funds, we're the first to pass these dollars immediately to local school districts, and we're the first to protect teachers' jobs with Recovery Act dollars. I'll continue to fight for every available dollar to Recovery Act funding and am committed to sending those dollars quickly out into our schools, into our communities, and into our economy."

The funds now flow through the California Department of Education (CDE) and are available immediately to be administered by Superintendent of Public Instruction Jack O'Connell. School districts will apply for their funds through an

application process managed by CDE.

With his Recovery Task Force, Governor Schwarzenegger last week signed the application for the funding, opening the door for approximately \$4.9 billion to flow into California and quickly to schools where it will preserve education programs and protect jobs, as well as an additional \$1.1 billion to protect other state programs. Now, less than two weeks after the federal government made the funding guidelines available, school districts can tap into the first installment of that funding: \$3.1 billion, of which approximately \$2.6 billion is estimated to go toward K-12 schools and \$537 million toward the California State University and University of California systems.

"These important funds come with significant flexibility that will allow our schools and universities to meet their most critical needs while continuing to improve student performance," said Secretary of Education Glen Thomas. "The quick action of the Recovery Task Force means our educators can now begin taking action to protect jobs and programs." ■

migrants, permanent migrants and undocumented or irregular migrants," the report said.

The almanac was published last year by the IMDI, a non-government organization concerned with migration issues, to document the total number of Filipinos who have gone overseas, whether they left temporarily or permanently, and with or without proper documents.

Global model

But, as migration researcher Benjamin Cariño said, despite the importance of international migration to national policy, there are serious limitations

in the country's international migration statistics, as well as the whole system of collecting these.

The 357-page almanac is divided into three chapters dealing with the following topics: Harmonized statistics on overseas Filipinos, the countries of destination of Filipinos and the provinces of origin of overseas Filipinos.

The section on harmonized statistics presents data on the number of migrant workers across the globe, categorized as "temporary," "permanent residents" and "undocumented or irregular migrants."

It also contains information on the number of migrant households (defined as a family having a member working overseas) in the country, remittance flows and the impact of overseas migration on development.

Increased remittances

The flow of remittances has increased so much over the years that the estimated figure was bigger than the income of almost 70 percent of the country's provinces.

According to Opiniano, the statistical data used in the almanac came from the following government agencies: Commission on Filipinos Overseas, Department of Tourism, Department of Foreign Affairs, Department of Labor and Employment, Philippine Overseas Employment Administration, Overseas Workers Welfare Administration, Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas, National Statistics Office, National Statistical Coordination Board, and the Bureau of Immigration. ■
