Job openings scarce even as layoffs slow

WASHINGTON — Companies may be laying off workers at a slower pace, but that doesn't mean more businesses are hiring.

There were 2.7 million jobs available nationwide in March, according to a government report released Tuesday, May 12, down from 3 million in February and 4 million a year ago. It's also the lowest number in the eight years the Labor Department has tracked job openings.

Other recent reports indicate that while layoffs may be slowing compared with the waves announced earlier this year, hiring hasn't picked up much since the department gathered the job openings data in March.

Without new hiring, the unemployment rate will continue to rise. That's because many people who were discouraged and

stopped looking for work at the depths of a recession customarily return to the labor market once a recovery begins. If jobs aren't available, those new job seekers are added to the total of unemployed workers.

The Society for Human Resource Management said Friday its monthly survey found slightly more manufacturers plan to cut jobs in May than add workers.

While about one-third of service sector companies plan to hire this month, the survey found, that's still below last May, when about half planned to hire. Another 15 percent plan to cut jobs. The figures are based on a survey of about 1,000 companies.

The Conference Board said Monday, May 11, that its Employment Trends Index dipped 0.7 percent in April, a smaller decline than in recent months but still a

sign of labor market weakness. Gad Levanon, senior economist for the Conference Board, said the job market has improved from earlier this year, but he doesn't expect job openings to increase for several more months.

Employers are continuing to eliminate thousands of positions in an effort to cut costs. The economy lost a net total of 539,000 jobs in April, the Labor Department said Friday, May 8.

While elevated, that figure was the lowest in six months and below an average of 700,000 job cuts per month in the first quarter. All told, employers have eliminated 5.7 million jobs since the recession began in December 2007.

The unemployment rate reached 8.9 percent in April, and many economists expect it to reach 10 percent by next year.

Big numbers in LAPD Gun Buyback Program

LOS ANGELES—Los Angeles authorities have collected almost 1,700 firearms in a program where gun owners can surrender their weapons for gift cards.

So many guns were turned in to the highly publicized gun buyback program that organizers ran out of the gift cards that were offered in exchange for the firearms.

City Mayor Antonio Villaraigosa said in a statement that 1,698 guns were turned in Saturday, May 9, at 19 locations around the city in the Gun Buyback Program, which is designed to get guns off the streets and reduce shootings.

"I want to thank the LA residents who joined us today in securing a safer city for every family by turning in their guns and helping us get dangerous weapons off the streets," Mayor

Antonio Villaraigosa said. "No legislation can replace the unified voice heard today of a community saying no to guns, gangs and indiscriminate violence in our neighborhoods."

Participants received a \$100 supermarket gift card if they turned in a handgun or rifle and a \$200 Visa gift card for a high caliber weapon. A total of 1,302 gift cards were issued for a total worth of \$130,200.

Last year, more than 1,500 city residents fell victim to shootings with 65 percent of the shots fired from a gang member's gun. (AP)
