Do you remember World War II in the Philippines?

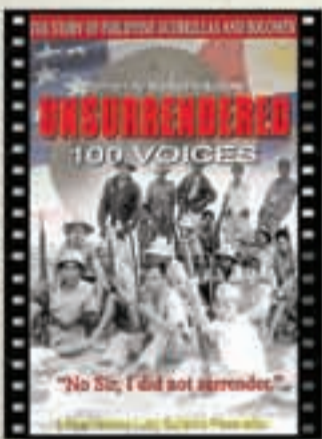
The Filipinos fought in that brutal war not of their own choice but because they were merely drawn into it.

When it broke out in 1941, the Philippines was awaiting independence from the United States. The US colonized the country in 1901 only four years after the Philippine Revolution of 1896 freed the Filipinos from 300 years of Spanish rule. World War II thus proved brutal and more than a test of courage, it became a test of faith.

Most must have heard of the Bataan Death March from Capas, Tarlac to Bataan. A few Filipino and American veterans who are still alive could have been in that horrifying trek. But how many have witnessed the rape of Manila?

What most have not seen or forgotten is captured three award-winning documentary films by Lucky Guillermo and Peter Parsons of Spyron-AV Manila. These films will be shown free of charge exclusively at The Bayanihan Center, Seafood City in Vallejo on June 13, 20 and 27 in celebration of Philippine Independence. 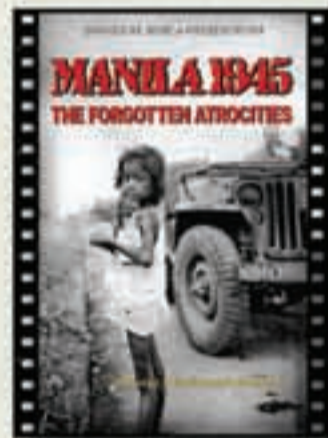
About the films:

"Secret War" is the story of Cmdr. Charles "Chick" Parsons, the man Gen. Douglas MacArthur called, "the bravest man he had ever known."

The story crediting this man and the brave Filipino and American guerrillas is long overdue. These were the men who enabled MacArthur to fulfill the pledge he made shortly after the fall of Bataan and Corregidor "I shall return."

About the filmmaker

Lucky Guillermo is a multi-awarded documentary filmmaker in Manila. He won the Golden Quill Award, the equivalent of the Emmy, and the Anvil five times. Peter Parsons has done extensive research on WWII. DVD copies of the 3 docufilms will be available at \$20 each during the showing.
